Community:

Moscow is the capital of the Russian Federation and the seat of parliament and central administration. It is a cultural center with numerous museums, theatres, conservatories, concert, and ballet halls.

Curriculum and Faculty:

The High School offers an entirely college preparatory curriculum for students in grades 9 – 12. Students are ability grouped only in Russian language classes.

Students that complete graduation requirements receive a High School diploma. Some classes meet 3 times weekly, twice for 1 ½ hours and one time for 45minutes. Other classes as well as Math and Russian language classes meet 4 or 5 days/week for 45 minutes and P.E. and Health classes which meet twice weekly.

Most faculty members are native English speakers, except in the area of Russian language classes.

Accreditation:

Hinkson is accredited by the **Association of Christian Schools International** located in Colorado Springs, Colorado. A second accreditation is through **Middle States Accreditation of Colleges and Schools** located in Philadelphia, PA.



School:

Hinkson Christian Academy is a Christian, private, kindergarten – 12th grade, co-educational, day school located in Moscow, Russia. Approximately 120 students are currently enrolled representing 9 different countries.

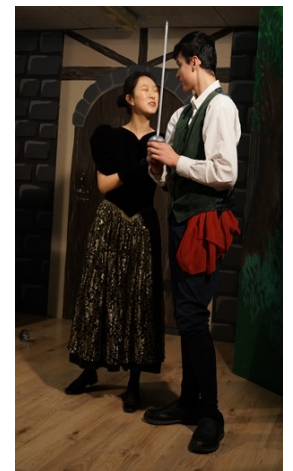
All classes at H C A are conducted in English.

The school facilities include 22 classrooms, computer lab, art room, music room, science lab, ESL and learning resource classrooms, library, gymnasium with weight room and lockers room. The average high school class size is 15 students.



Extracurricular Activities:

Students in seventh through 12th grade have the opportunity to participate in the following activities: Student Council, Beta Club, choral performances, annual school play, regional sports competitions in soccer, and basketball.



Testing:

The majority of HCA graduates apply to colleges and universities in the United States. In order to prepare the students, we offer PSAT/NMSQT to all 10th and 11th grade students. All students are tested yearly with NWEA's MAP: Growth.
